## Keynote Speaker: Professor Caroline McMillen



Professor McMillen is Deputy Vice Chancellor and Vice President: Research and Innovation in the University of South Australia.

She graduated with a BA (Hons) and Doctor of Philosophy at Oxford University before completing her medical degree at the University of Cambridge. She has an international reputation as a biomedical researcher for her work which focuses on the early origins of adult health.

Caroline holds many leadership positions, including as the Deputy Director of the ARC/NHMRC National Network. She is the only Australian Commission Chair of the International Union of Physiological Societies.

In 2006 Caroline was presented with a Woman of Achievement Award by the South Australian Chapter of Zonta International, a global service organization of executives in business and the professions who pool their expertise to advance the status of women through action and advocacy.
